MAJOR REQUIREMENTS = 36 credits

H&J CORE REQUIREMENTS = 18 credits

- HJS 250 **Justice in the Western Traditions**
Prerequisites: ENG 101-102 or ENG 101-201, one of the required general education courses in literature, history, or philosophy, and one of the required general education courses in the social sciences
- HJS 310 **Comparative Perspectives on Justice**
Prerequisites: HJS 250 and junior standing
- HJS 315 **Research Methods** (usually offered only in the Spring)
Prerequisites: HJS 250, and one of the required general education courses in each of literature, history, and philosophy
- HJS 410 **Problems and Theory: Thesis Prospectus** (offered only in the Fall)
Prerequisites: HJS 315, and 9 credits in the interdisciplinary components of the major
- HJS 415 **Thesis in Humanities and Justice** (offered only in the Spring)
Prerequisite: HJS 410
- Topics in Political or Legal Theory – choose one:**
POL 375 **Law, Order, Justice, and Society**
Prerequisites: ENG 201, POL 101 and Junior standing
OR
LAW 301 **Jurisprudence**
Prerequisites: ENG 201, LAW 203 or POL 230 and Junior standing

H&J DISCIPLINARY REQUIREMENT = 18 credits

At least 12 credits must be at or above the 300 level.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Should I take the H&J core requirements in order? [HJS 250 → HJS 310 → HJS 315 → HJS 410 → HJS 415]

All HJS courses should be taken consecutively. However, sometimes students will need to take HJS 310 with or after HJS 315. Questions? Consult with your HJ advisor or with the Major Coordinator.

2. How many of my 18 disciplinary elective credits (history or literature or philosophy) must be at or above the 300 level?

12 credits = 4 courses. Contact the Major Coordinator for exceptions.

3. May I take all my disciplinary electives in one discipline or must I take courses in all 3?

You may take all 18 credits in one discipline but it is not recommended. (Humanities and Justice is an interdisciplinary major!)

4. May I also count my disciplinary courses toward a minor?

Often, yes: consult the Minor Advisor in the specific Department to determine what the requirements are and which courses can be counted. Be sure that you take any required core courses in the Minor as well as any prerequisites for upper level courses.

5. Do I have to have a minor?

No: it is not required, but it is a good idea because having one or more minors on your transcript will suggest that you are hard-working and inquisitive!

6. What should I do if *Degree Works* does not count some of my disciplinary electives toward the Humanities and Justice Major?

Consult the Major Coordinator.

7. How can I find out which ISP courses satisfy my General Education requirements and / or my disciplinary electives in Humanities and Justice?
